vanda: Battlefront 'Stabilized'; Official Denies Arrests

[Text] Nairobi, 4 Oct (AFP) -- The battlefront between the bels from northeastern Rwanda and the regular Rwandan Army was play stabilized around 70 km from Kigali, the Rwandan capital, here the authorities have been waiting for an intervention from plgium. According to diplomats, the former colonial power portedly agreed to reply favorably to Rwanda's intervention equest on Tuesday night.

(In Brussels, the private television network RTL-TVI has inconced that between 150 and 300 paratroopers of the 2 Commando attalion are preparing to leave for Rwanda.)

However, it is not known what mission these soldiers will be sked to undertake -- whether they will take an active part in the attle against the antigovernment forces led by "Commander Fred", or ill only be sent to protect the more than 1,600 Belgians living in ne "country of 1,001 hills."

In Kigali, the situation is apparently calm, several sources ported this morning. As for the front, it was stabilized around le Gatsibo-Gabiro line, some 70 km northeast of Kigali, which the bels are intent on taking, according to diplomats contacted in lirobi.

According to official Rwandan sources, the president, Major meral Juvenal Habyarimana, has returned to Kigali, while the wandan ambassadors to Burundi and Tanzania have been summoned by he authorities of those countries.

In Bujumbura, the Rwandan ambassador was received by the head of tate, Major Pierre Buyoya, who affirmed to him that nobody capable f helping "Commander Fred's" men in southern Rwanda has crossed the urundi-Rwanda border. According to Burundian sources, the border as been completely closed, especially to prevent Rwandan refugees rom penetrating into Burundi.

Diplomatic sources also reported that the battles in northeastern and will soon have a negative impact on Burundi's economy.

ujumbura is in fact completely dependent for its supplies on the northern corridor" which passes through Rwanda, Uganda, and across enya to the Port of Mombasa. In Dar es Salaam, Ambassador Thomas unyanezi has been summoned by the permanent secretary of the

inzanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Mr. Ashur Abbas. Mr. Abbas is said to have complained about a bombing attack on Tuesday ainst a group of Rwandan refugees in Tanzania by an aircraft of known origin, but which was probably Rwandan, it has been learned om a very reliable source.

In Kigali, the permanent secretary of the Rwandan Ministry of fense, Colonel Leonidas Rusatira, has denied that there have been stematic arrests of Tutsis in the capital. Diplomatic sources had dicated that a wave of arrests affecting politicians and military rsonnel of the Tutsi ethnic group had begun in Kigali following e offensive of Fred Rwigyema's troops. Similar rumors however rsisted in Kigali today, according to informed sources.

Col. Rusatira also told AFP that no foreign mercenary was present the ranks of the rebels. The only arrests concern persons moving out during the curfew hours and who are being released mediately, said the permanent secretary of the Defense Ministry.

1. Rusatira estimated the number of rebels, who are trying to erthrow the regime of President Juvenal Habyarimana, which has an in power since 1973, at 10,000.
